Program description

Wednesday afternoon will be dedicated to breakout and plenary discussions of Nissenbaum's talk and the discussion starters. Participants will have the opportunity to choose one of three breakout groups before the workshop; groups will have the same members and go to the same rooms in **Breakouts 1 and 2**. Each group will begin discussion with one of the discussion starters (assigned in advance); the groups will then be free to discuss other matters as the members wish.

Each group will include one facilitator and one reporter. **Facilitators** are encouraged to join in the discussion and are charged with keeping the discussion on track, encouraging a civil tone, and ensuring that all group members have a chance to contribute and no members dominate (including the facilitators themselves). **Reporters** may also join in the discussion, but are expected to take good notes and provide a summary of the discussion in the plenary session following the breakout.
