Nineteenth Annual Workshop, May 15-18, 2012

The Poynter Center for the Study of Ethics and American Institutions announces its 19th annual Teaching Research Ethics Workshop. Designed for faculty who need to teach research ethics to students and for administrators who manage research programs at universities, the program covers a variety of topics using a range of teaching methods, presented by experts in the field. Participants receive pre-workshop readings, supplementary materials, and a CD of public-domain documents and links to related Web sites. In addition to plenary sessions, participants select an intensive track that meets three times and two breakout sessions for discussion of other topics.

Intensive tracks are: 1) Ethical Issues in Research with Human Subjects in Biomedical Research; 2) Ethical Issues in Research with Human Subjects in Social, Behavioral, and Humanistic Research; 3) Ethical Theory.

Breakout sessions include: 1) Program and Curricular Development; 2) Selecting, Creating, and Using Case Studies; 3) Tactics and Techniques for Teaching Research Ethics (offered twice); 4) Developing a Syllabus; 5) Oversight and Administration of Research.

The program cost is \$700. Participants are responsible for their own hotel reservations; a block of rooms is available at the Indiana Memorial Union, the site of the workshop.
